- Your sisters and brothers.
- Your daughters and sons.

It's important to include all your family members, whether or not they've been diagnosed with cancer.

It will be helpful if you record your family members' first names. The details will be entered into the CanRisk tool to create a family tree diagram and will appear on the CanRisk report.
